9:10 AM – Maritime Forecast 2050

Simon Mockler, Head of Maritime Advisory, North America, DNV GL

Maritime Forecast 2050 including: Shipping must prepare for and start on a decarbonization pathway this decade; A massive scale-up of new technologies and fuels is needed; Regulations and incentives will impact already from 2023; Decarbonization will effect costs, asset values and earning capacity; and how over the next decade shipping must develop a new generation of carbon-neutral ships.

The aviation sector, similar to the maritime sector, is responsible for close to 2% of GHG emissions globally per year. Over the last few years, the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) has created a framework for the sector for reporting and reducing GHG emissions, which has been adopted by a number of member countries, including Canada and the US. What lessons might there be for the maritime sector in looking at this framework as a blueprint for the years ahead, given the actions the IMO has taken so far.
